

How to find the debate video and send to teachers

- 1. Log in to the Smart School Councils platform using your school details.

FOR: Celebrities should be held to a higher standard of behaviour

We're going to share reasons for both sides of the debate, then it's up to you to think of the rest!

Celebrities have a lot of influence over others

You might be thinking that they have a lot of influence over others. Celebrities have millions of followers who look up to them. Their actions can inspire or mislead, so they have a responsibility to set a positive example. For instance, Kim Kardashian recently created change in US prison reform after promoting particular people's cases.

Celebrities are role models

You could say that whether they like it or not, celebrities are often seen as role models. Fans will imitate the behaviour they see their idols do like when Donald Trump wore a plaster on his ear after being hurt, so his fans did too. Holding them to higher standards ensures they don't set bad examples.

Impact on the youth

Young people are particularly impressionable and may emulate celebrity behaviour. Ensuring celebrities adhere to higher standards helps promote positive development among youth.



Celebrities' actions can impact companies they work with

According to an Ipsos study, 27% of global consumers would consider stopping their purchase of a product if its celebrity endorser was reported to be engaging in personal misconduct, highlighting the potential consequences of celebrities' actions on brands and consumer choices. AGAINST: Celebrities should not be held to a higher standard of behaviour

Now let's change positions and consider why you might argue that celebrities should not be held to a higher standard of behaviour than everyone else.



Being scrutinised is unfair pressure

You might be thinking that being scrutinised is unfair pressure. Celebrities are human too, with human problems and expecting them to be perfect is unrealistic. Holding them to higher standards might put unnecessary pressure on them, leading to mental or physical health issues.

Should there be different rules for different people?

Or you could ask should there be different rules for different people? It's unfair to expect celebrities to follow stricter rules. Why should they face more criticism for the same mistakes that others make?

They should have the right to privacy

Despite their public status, celebrities are individuals entitled to personal lives without undue scrutiny or expectations beyond those of ordinary people. So no matter what we do, it should not be the public's business.



Unrealistic Expectations

Fans often expect much more from celebrities due to their one-sided relationship with them, imposing higher behavioral expectations. This often means their mistakes are magnified and vilified compared to similar actions by non-celebrities. (Source:Spiked, LINK)

Yes

Scandals can hurt their career

Celebrities can experience significant declines in their social media followings due to controversies. For example, Lizzo saw a 6.7% drop in Instagram followers after facing legal issues and criticism, reflecting how public perception can swiftly change in response to celebrities' actions. (Source: NY Times, <u>LINK</u>)

They have influence over public behaviour

High-profile endorsements by celebrities like Taylor Swift and Beyoncé aimed to mobilise voters and increase political engagement during the 2024 U.S. presidential election. (Source: Vox, LINK)

The public think it's important for celebrities to be authentic, more than their family A YouGov survey revealed that only 22% of respondents believe it's unimportant for celebrities to provide an authentic account of themselves on social media. (Source: YouGov, <u>LINK</u>)

The public believe celebrities should prioritise their mental health


An Ipsos survey revealed that almost 7 in 10 (69%) Britons believe celebrities are entitled to prioritise their mental health, even if it leads to cancelled performances. This indicates an allowance for celebrities to maintain well-being and mental health above the expectations of them by fans such as performances or social media presence. (Source: Ipsos, LINK)

Controversy does not always mean the end of your career

The case of Ariana Grande, who faced various personal controversies yet continued to achieve professional success, illustrates the complexity of holding celebrities to higher standards and the potential for redemption through positive actions. (Source: Varsity, LINK)

They are entertainers not experts

Celebrities are primarily entertainers, and expecting them to serve as moral exemplars or experts in fields such as politics may detract from their artistic contributions. (Source: Spiked, LINK)
