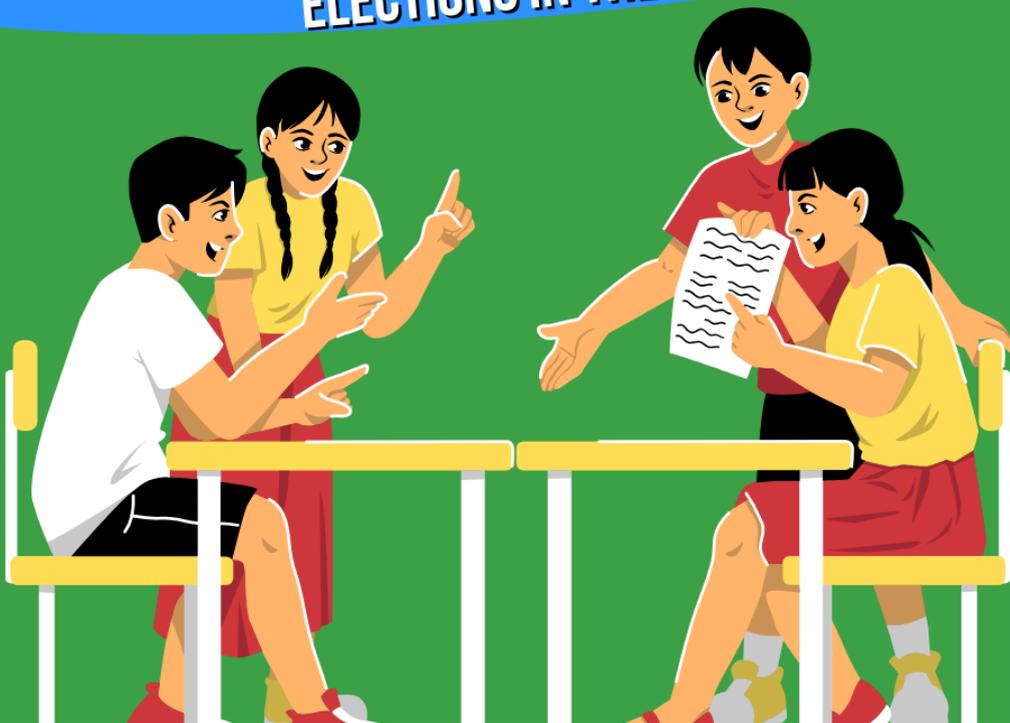

How to find the debate video and send to teachers

1. Log in to the [Smart School Councils platform](#) using your school details.

Introduction



Welcome to Big Debate Club!

My name is Becky and today we are debating the question...

Should we change how we vote in elections in the UK?

It is Welcome to your Vote Week, so we are celebrating democracy by helping you understand how it works and how to get involved. Today we focus on the most important way to take part - voting. In the UK we have the first past the post voting system, where the person or party with the most votes wins even if more people voted against them. It is simple and creates a single strong government who can make decisions quickly.

However, in the 2024 election, Labour won 63% of the seats with only 34% of the votes which seems un-representative. If we changed to a proportional representation system, the votes would be closer to the amount of seats, meaning it is fairer and more voices are heard. But which would you prefer? You decide.

A strong majority (like Labour's in 2024) can make it easier to pass laws and govern without prolonged coalition negotiations. FOR: We should change how we vote in UK elections

We're going to share reasons for both sides of the debate, then it's up to you to think of the rest!

We can make democracy fairer and more representative



You might be thinking that we could make democracy fairer and more representative. In the 2019 general election, the Liberal Democrats got 11.5% of the national vote but only 1.7% of the seats because we use the first past the post system, where the person with the most votes wins, even if more people voted against them. If we switch to Proportional Representation, seats in Parliament match the number of votes each party gets. For example, if a party wins 20% of the national vote, they get 20% of the seats.

Making change could mean more voices are heard

You could say that making change could mean more voices are heard. Proportional Representation allows smaller parties to gain seats, as they could gain some seats if they gain some votes, meaning Parliament reflects more diverse opinions from voters across the country.

AGAINST: We should not change how we vote in UK elections

Now let's change positions and consider why you might argue that we should not change how we vote in elections in the UK.



Our system makes it simple for everyone

You might think that our current system makes it simple for everyone. First Past the Post is easy to understand - one person, one vote, most votes wins. It's been used for centuries and people know how it works. So why complicate things?

Our systems creates single stable governments

Or you could also say our system creates single stable governments. This system usually leads to one party having a majority, which helps create strong governments. Countries with proportional systems often end up with coalitions, which can be slow to make decisions.

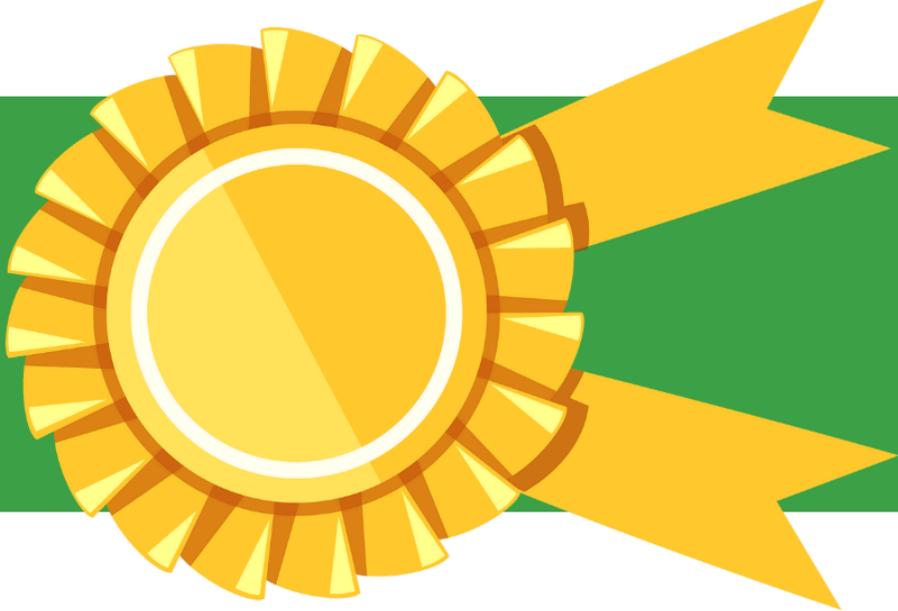

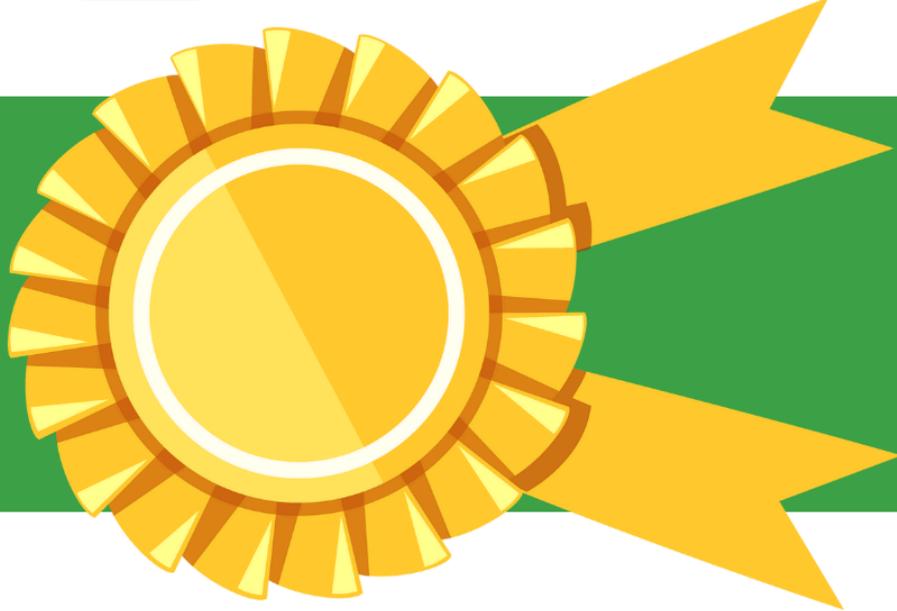

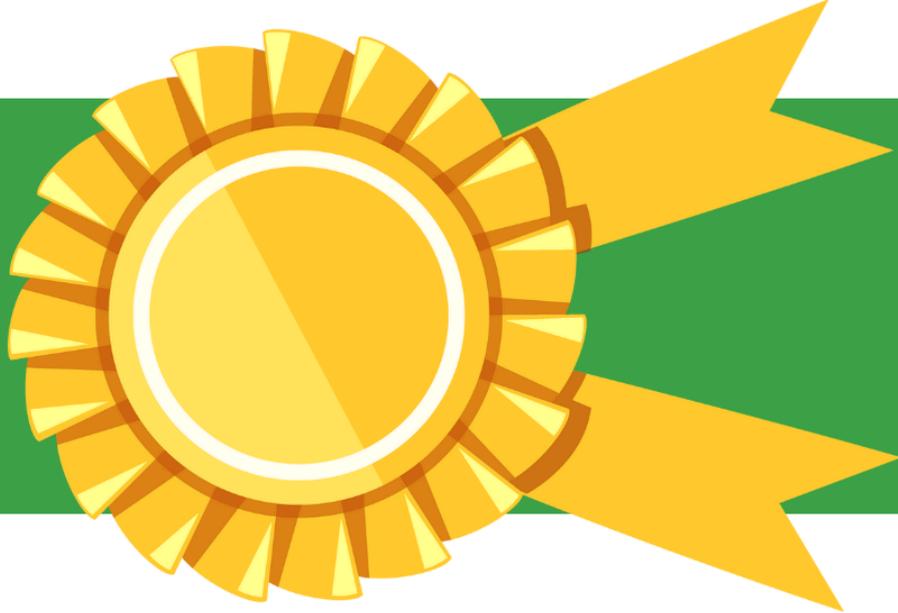
