

How to find the debate video and send to teachers

1. Log in to the [Smart School Councils platform](#) using your school details.
2. Click on the blue Class Meeting Tool button in the dashboard.
3. Click on 'Next Meeting' at the top of the page.

5. If the debate topic is part of this week's question, it will appear there. Otherwise, click 'Search All' and type in the debate topic you're looking for.

FOR: Planting trees is more important than building houses

We're going to share reasons for both sides of the debate, then it's up to you to think of the rest!

More trees means more protection against climate change



You might be thinking that more trees means more protection against climate change. Trees absorb carbon dioxide, so not only do they clean the air we breathe but with less carbon dioxide, it also fights climate change and prevents the damage it causes.

More trees mean more habitat for animals

You could say that more trees mean more habitat for animals. Planting lots of trees together can create a forest, and forests are home to thousands of animal species that lose habitat when trees are cut down, making sure species can thrive in their forest home.

Trees can reduce air pollution and help prevent thousands of deaths. For instance, in 2020, natural removal of air pollution via trees by greenspace in the UK was estimated to avoid 2,001 deaths and 49,126 years of life lost. (Source: Woodland Trust, [LINK](#))

Trees can aid in regulating heat

Trees can be helpful in cities when it comes to climate. Trees in city spaces can cool street temperatures by up to 5 °C during heatwaves, which reduces the heat's danger and heat-related health risks. (Source: TCV, [LINK](#))

Trees can prevent flooding

Trees can also be useful in cities for managing rainwater and reducing surface water flooding. Whether through leaf absorbing the water, which can reduce water collecting by up to 99% compared with tarmac surfaces, or through root absorption, it can mean water is reduced and therefore reduce the ability to form floods. 




